Performance Management and Innovative Human Resource Training through Flexible Production Systems aimed at Enhancing Competitiveness of SMEs

Abstract: In the current knowledge economy companies need to develop competitive advantages based on an adequate and intensive use of innovation processes and ICT that are becoming essential elements of business success in today's European market. The purpose of this article is to introduce and discuss the benefits of on-line training on automation and innovation fields and try to explain their organizational impact on small and medium-sized enterprises (SME).
